What's New in the 2018 CAA Application?

Very little, with one big change!

The following changes are reflected in the 2018 CAA application (for the 2017 calendar year):

- The Required list was modified to *remove* one requirement:
 - Web hosting by STC is **no longer a requirement**.
- Web hosting by STC has been moved to the optional Bonus section with a value of 3 points.
- The Mentor Board item has been removed from Section 4 – Member Engagement.
- The minimum time requirement for virtual workshops was changed from 3 hours to 2 hours.

Due to these changes, there are now 68 base points, with a possible of 13 bonus points.

Awards will be given for the following total, verified activity points:

Platinum Community Award – 61 or more points

Gold Community Award – 54 to 60 points

Silver Community Award – 47 to 53 points

Bronze Community Award – 44 to 46 points
